The open race will be for all youth 7th thru 12 grades and will include any adult that wishes to race.

There will be trophies and awards. Cars will be awarded on speed and design.

The traveling trophy will go to the winner of the open race of Grand Prix 2009. (The same church has had this traveling plaque for three years in a row and needs some serious competition.)

There will also be a run off of the three first place winners to determine the fastest car for Grand Prix 2010.

Sparks: K – 2nd grade

T&T: 3rd – 6th grade

Open: 7th – 12th grade and any adult that wishes to race.

Each club including the open will be awarded on speed and design.

Lunches will need to be taken care of before you arrive.

We are asking that every church participate in this fun time together. You have plenty of time to prepare and you have us available to you for help if you need it. Scripture says that we should come together as one in the body of Christ so let us come together.

Awana Grand Prix Rules and Procedure for 2010

Rules & Procedure. (\$5.00 Entry fee per racer.)

- One car per participant.
- The maximum allowable weight is 5 ounces.
- The maximum length is 7 inches including wheels.
- The maximum width is 2 ¾ of an inch.
- The maximum height is 3 inches.
- You will need at least 3/8 of an inch chassis clearance for track.
- May only use Awana wheels and axles. Wheel width may not be altered. Wheels other than Awana wheels will result in disqualification.
- The Only lubricant allowed is graphite powder. Can be found at Hobby Lobby and some Wal Marts.
- Graphite lubricant may only be applied before cars are checked in. No lubricant may be added to car after it is checked in for the duration of race.
- In the event that any trouble should occur during race with participant's car they will be allowed one pit stop for corrections. No lubricant while in the pit. **More than one pit stop after race begins will result in disqualification.** There will be no exceptions.
- If car should jump track during race, this race will be rerun with the same cars. If that same car jumps track again, that car will be disqualified and taken from race.
- Each clubber or participant will be issued a score card at check in. Each person is responsible for their own score card. If score card is lost, that person will be disqualified and removed from race.
- Stepping over or on tracks could result in disqualification. It is much advised that each club make your clubbers aware of this fact.
- Each participant will be given a number on their score card and for their car. This assigned number must remain on the car for the entire race.
- Racers must remain seated until their number is called to race. That racer will then take his/her car from staging area and place it on the track themselves. Racer will then go to the end of the track to retrieve their car.
- When participant is not racing their car will need to remain in the staging area.
- If it is stated in these rules it is so!
- The race coordinator can change or modify the rules at any time; any questions or disputes will be answered or settled by him. His word is law and all determinations are final!

Each participant will have to weigh in at the pit table before checking in. This will give racers the opportunity to go over their cars to make sure their cars are ready for the race. This will also be your last opportunity to add graphite to your wheels. Remember this car has to make it for at least 16 trips down the track. The pit crew will be available at the pit table to help if needed.

After participant has checked in their car they will then take their car to the staging area where it will remain until race begins.
